Richard Kebyll of Thorney in the parish  
of St. Peter of Stowemarket.

- to be buried in the churchyard of the parish church  
of St. Peter of Stowe
- to the high altar 2s for his tithes forgotten
- to the expenses & costs of making the Gildhall there,  
not yet paid 6s 8d.
- to each of the houses of Friars in Ipswich 3s 4d.
- to the reparation of the way leading from his  
house to Fykemannes Brygg 10s.
- to Rich<sup>d</sup> his son all his lands & tenements in Stowe  
Thorney & elsewhere that he died seized of,  
when he (his son) comes of age, on condition  
that his (testator's) wife should have her keep  
& clothing out of the lands & tenements for her  
life if she remain unmarried & if she do not  
remain unmarried, Rich<sup>d</sup> (son) to enjoy them
- to Thos. his son 10 marks in money or goods to that  
value at coming of age, provided he behaves  
well towards Margaret his mother & his (testator's)  
attorneys.
- to Wm. his son 10 marks, likewise
- to Edward his son 10 marks, likewise
- to Katherine his daughter 5 marks at coming of age.
- to Marion " " " " " " " " " "
- if any of children die before coming of age  
others to be their heirs
- if all children die before coming of age, then  
Margaret the wife of the same Rich<sup>d</sup> to have all  
the legacies to give & dispose of at her will  
except the lands & tenements which ought to  
remain to the right heirs of Rich<sup>d</sup> Kebyll, sen;  
father of the said Rich<sup>d</sup> Kebyll
- to Margaret his (testator's) wife all household  
necessities & utensils together with beds,

napery, & all other ornaments & all her wood  
(? carp) & all animals & thier young & all  
ploughs (or plough teams?) & horses & all their  
equipment pertaining to ploughs & ploughing.
